WELCOME TO COWBRIDGE PHYSIC GARDEN

The Physic Garden is located within the Old Hall grounds in the centre of Cowbridge and is bounded on its south side by the medieval town wall.

In the mid eighteenth century the Edmondes family acquired Old Hall, a house fronting the High Street, improved the house and developed the gardens. Records show that in the nineteenth century the walled enclosure in the south-east corner of the gardens was formally laid out with beds and paths, a layout which suggests an earlier origin. This is where the Physic Garden has been created, its formal design echoing the pattern of earlier centuries.

After the departure of the Edmondes family from Old Hall in the 1920s the Physic Garden site became, successfully, a kitchen garden for Cowbridge Grammar School and a tree nursery for the Local Authority. Neglected for many years thereafter, by the end of the twentieth century it was an overgrown wilderness. Its transformation into the Physic Garden has been the work of the Cowbridge Physic Garden Trust, a charitable body set up to carry forward a project initiated by the South and Mid Glamorgan Branch of the Welsh Historic Gardens Trust. Clearance of the site began early in 2005. Landscaping and construction work started in August 2005 and was completed in August 2006. Planting began in September 2006 and will continue for some time to come. This is a garden in progress which needs time to develop and mature.

The layout and content of the garden are typical of the eighteenth century, incorporating the formal, the functional (not only medicinal, but also culinary, perfumery, cosmetics and dyestuffs) and the aesthetic. Only plants found in Britain before 1800 are included in the garden.

Twelve central beds are devoted to plants which, over many centuries, have had medicinal properties attributed to them, and some of which have a recognized medicinal value today. Each of these beds contains plants specific to a part of the body or a particular illness and each bed is appropriately labeled (e.g. Kidneys, Eyes, Nerves, Lungs etc.).

In the areas around the perimeter of the garden the emphasis is on colour and fragrance, but here again the medicinal and 'soothing' value of the plants is recognised. Fruit trees include apple, pear, walnut, quince and mulberry. The vines trained against the walls were a gift from Cowbridge's twin town of Clisson.

The tranquil atmosphere of the Physic Garden is enhanced by the central fountain. Seats in the pavilions and alongside the paths enable visitors to enjoy the Garden at leisure.

BONES ESGYRN

ANGELICA Angelica archangelica Talfedel
Other names: THE HOLY GHOST HERB.

The plant was named after St. Michael the Archangel who appeared to a monk to announce the herb as a cure for the plague. Culpeper claimed it was used for rotten teeth, rabid dog bites and resisted poisons by defending and comforting the heart, blood and spirits Used as a flavouring for chartreuse and its glassy green stems candied and used for cake decorations. Used medicinally for rheumatism and as a bath for rheumatic pain.

BORAGE Cichorium intybus Ysgellog

Other names: STARFLOWER: BEE BREAD

Used traditionally for rheumatism and rheumatoid arthritis.

CHICORY Borago officinalis Tafod y Fuwch

Relieves rheumatism.

COMFREY Symphytum officinalis Llysiau'r Cwlwm

Other names: KNIT-BONE: BRUIISEWORT: ALL HEAL: JOINT TOGETHER.

Culpeper stated that if bones 'be boiled with dissevered pieces of flesh in a pot, it will join them together again' - why one should do this is not known. Mends bones, fractures, ruptures and bruises.

COWSLIP Primula veris Briallu Mair

Other names: KEY FLOWER: HERB PETER: ST. PETER'S KEYS: OUR LADY'S BUNCH OF KEYS; GALLIGASKINS: PAIGLE: PALSYWORT

Relieves arthritis

DANDELION Taraxacum officinalis Dant y Llew

Other names: BLOWBALL: PRIESTS CROWN: PISS-A-BED.

The name comes from 'dens leonis' - a lion's tooth - which refers to the shapes of the leaves. The earliest medicinal mention in Europe was made by the Physicians of Myddfai in the 13th century. Chronic joint complaints and rheumatoid arthritis

DYER'S GREENWOOD Genista tinctoria Melynog y Waun

Other names: WOOD WAXEN

A yellow dye has been made from the plant since Roman times and used to dye fabrics. Mixed with Isatis tinctoria (woad) it produced Lincoln Green as worn by Robin Hood. Used medicinally for rheumatism and externally for fractured bones.

ELECAMPANE Inula helenium Marchalan Relieves pains in the joints.

ECHINACEA Echinacea purpurea Echinacea

Other names: CONEFLOWER: PURPLE CONEFLOWER.

Used to relieve arthritis.



FLAX Linum perenne Llin amaeth

(L. usitatissimum)

Pains in the joints and rheumatoid arthritis.

HEARTSEASE Viola tricolor Trilliw

Other names: see **DIGESTION**

Relieves gout and rheumatoid arthritis.

HOUSELEEK Sempervivum tectorum Llysiau Pen Tai

Other names: HENS AND CHICKS: SUNGREEN: THOR'S BEARD: JUPITER'S

BEARD: THUNDER FLOWER.

Relieves rheumatic pain.

JOE PYE WEED Eupatorium purpureum Byddon chwerw

Other names: QUEEN OF THE MEADOW: GRAVEL ROOT: PURPLE BONESET In America it is used to treat a type of influenza known as 'bone-break fever'. Also used to treat rheumatism.

LAVENDER (FRENCH) Lavandula stoechas Lafant ffrangeg

Other names: ITALIAN LAVENDER: SPANISH LAVENDER

Taken to relive rheumatic ppain

LIQUORICE Glycyrrhiza glabra Llaethwyg

In 1305 Edward I taxed liquorice imports to pay for the repair of London Bridge. Dominican friars introduced it to Britain and today it is still made into Pontefract cakes. Used medicinally for rheumatism and arthritis.

MALLOW Malva sylvestris Hocysen Gyffredin

Other names: BLUE MALLOW: COMMON MALLOW: HIGH MALLOW

Grown as a medicinal plant since Roman times as a 'cure-all' herb.

MARJORAM Origanum vulgare Penrhudd

Other names: See list in CHILDBIRTH.

Taken for arthritis and eases aching muscles and joints.

POT MARIGOLDS Calendula officinalis Melyn Mair

Other names: MARY'S GOLD

Used to relieve pain of sprains and dislocations by soaking hot compresses in marigold tea. Also used as a salve for painful joints and muscles. Salve for painful joints and muscles. Compress for sprains and dislocations.

MULLEIN Verbascum thapsis Pannog Melyn

Other names: see list in DIGESTION.

Used for arthritic and rheumatic pain.

PRIMROSE Primula vulgaris Briallu Cyffredin

Primroses have similar medicinal properties to cowslips. Used for rheumatism, joint and nerve pain.



RED CLOVER Trifolium pretense Meillionen Goch

Other names: BEE BREAD.

A four leaf clover will bring good luck but a five leaf clover will bring riches for life! It maintains bone density and aids calcium storage in bones.

ROSEMARY Rosmarinus officinalis Rhosmari

Relieves rheumatism and arthritis.

SAGE Salvia officinalis Saets

Relieves arthritis.

SOAPWORT Saponaria officinalis Sebonllys

Other names: BOUNCING BET: TUMBLING TED: BRUISEWORT: FULLER'S HERB.

Used as early as the 8th C BC to make soap for washing and for washing cloth. Medicinally used to relieve arthritis.

SOLOMON'S SEALPolygonatum multiflorum Dagron Job

Other names: see list in CHILDBIRTH.

Said to heal broken bones.

STRAWBERRY (WILD) Fragaria vesca Mefusen y Goedwig Used for rheumatism.

<u>VERVAIN (WILD)</u> <u>Verbena officinalis</u> <u>Briw'r March</u> Other names: PIGEON'S GRASS: SIMPLERS JOY: DIVINE WEED.


It made people 'very pleasant, and made merry more jocularly.' Small cuts could be healed by using a vervain leaf as a plaster. Helped relieve rheumatism.

YARROW Achillea millefolium Milddail

Other names: NOSE BLEED: MILFOIL: THOUSAND LEAF: STAUNCH GRASS: CARPENTER'S PLANT: OLD MAN'S PEPPER: SOLDIER'S WOUNDWORT.

Cured rheumatism and arthritis.

COMFREY Symphytum officinalis





CHILDBIRTH GENEDIGAETH

ALECOST Tanacetum balsamita Mintys Mair

Eases the pain of childbirth.

AQUILEGIA Aquilegia vulgares Blodau'r Sipsi

Other names: COLUMBINE: GRANNY'S BONNETS

Helps 'delivery in childbirth'. (Culpepper)

BORAGE Borago officinalis Tafod y Fuwch

Other names: STARFLOWER: BEE BREAD.

'floures in sallads to exhilarate and make the minde glad' (Gerard) The flowers are still used in drinks and the leaves have a slight taste of cucumber. Stimulates mother 's milk.

CHAMOMILE Chamaemelum nobile Camri

Other names: ROMAN CHAMOMILE

Morning sickness and painful menstruation. Used as an uterine stimulant.

CLARY SAGE Salvia sclarea

Menstrual problems and during pregnancy. Helps to expel the afterbirth.

COMFREY Symphytum officinalis Llysiau'r Cwlwm

Other names: See list in BONES.

It was claimed that leaves of comfrey in bathwater would restore virginity.

Cured sore breasts during lactation.

CORIANDER Coriandrum sativum Brwysgedlys

Other names: CHINESE PARSLEY: CILANTRO.

One of the world's oldest herbs, its seeds were found in ancient Egyptian tombs Part of the ingredients in gripe water for babies.

DILL Anethum graveolens Llys v Gwewyr

Promotes milk in nursing mothers.

ECHINACEA Echinacea purpurea Echinacea

Other names: CONEFLOWER: PURPLE CONEFLOWER.

Native Americans used this plant as a a 'cure-all'. It's Greek name means hedgehog or sea urchin. Taken for pelvic inflammatory disease and VD.

ELECAMPANE Inula helenium Marchalan

Other names: HORSEHEAL SCABWORT

Cured diseases of the breast.

FENNEL Foeniculum vulgare Ffenigl

Increases milk flow in nursing mothers.

FEVERFEW Tanacetum parthenium Wermodwen

Helps expel the placenta after childbirth.



GERANIUM Geranium maculatum Pig yr Aran
Other names: AMERICAN CRANESBILL: WILD GERANIUM ALUMROOT:
SPOTTED GERANIUM

Native American tribes used it as a First Aid herb. Medicinally used for excessive menstruation, vaginal infections and VD

GOAT'S RUE Galega officinalis Llys Llaeth

Other names: FRENCH LILAC

Increases milk flow in both women and animals!

LADY'S MANTLE Alchemilla vulgaris Mantell Fair

'Women with large breasts, causing them to grow less.' (Culpeper) A drink was made which helped conception and to retain a birth. Medicinally used to relieve symptoms of the menopause and excessive menstruation, also for vaginal infections. Was an aphrodisiac.

LAVENDER (ENGLISH) Lavandula angustifolia Lafant Stimulates the peripheral circulation and uterus.

<u>LEMON BALM</u> <u>Melissa officinalis</u> <u>Gwenynddail</u> <u>Other names:</u> HONEY LEAF: BEE LEAF: BEE HERB: MELISSA: BALM.

'It causeth the mind and heart to become merry and driveth away all troublesome cares and thoughts' (Culpeper) Tonic for post childbirth and depression.

POT MARIGOLD Calendula officinalis Melyn Mair Other names: MARY'S GOLD.

Menstrual problems. Balances the female reproductive system and has oestrogen action which regulates hormones in the male and female body.

MARJORAM Origanum vulgare Penrhudd
Other names: WILD MARJORAM: JOY OF THE MOUNTAINS: OREGANO: WIND MARJORAM: EASTWARD MARJORAM: GROVE MARJORAM.

Effective against 'venomous beasts' and fleas and accidental poisoning! Stimulates the uterus and relieves painful menstruation.

MILK THISTLE Silybum marianum Ysgall Mair
Other names: OUR LADY'S MILK THISTLE: BLESSED MILK THISTLE: HOLY
THISTLE.

The variegated leaves were supposed to represent the Virgin Mary's milk. Increases the milk flow in nursing mothers.

PARSLEY Petroselium hortense Persli

Parsley wine is an aphrodisiac. It also stimulates the uterus and increases milk in nursing mothers.

PURPLE LOOSESTRIFE Lythrum salicaria Llysiau'r Milwr Coch

Other names:GRASS-POLY

Excessive menstruation.



SAGE Salvia officinalis Saets

Relieves hot flushes during menopause and reduces oestrogen loss. Cures vaginal infections and suppresses lactation.

SOLOMON'S SEAL Polygonatum multiflorum Dagrau Job

Other names: JACOB'S LADDER: DAVID'S HARP: VAGABOND'S FRIEND.

A classical medicinal herb used in China in 1st century AD Used for fertility and to increase milk flow.

SOUTHERNWOOD Artemesia abrotanum Chwerwlys

Other names: BOY'S LOVE: LAD'S LOVE: OLD MAN: MAIDEN'S RUIN: APPLE RINGIE: KISS IN MY CORNER.

Has aphrodisiac qualities. Uterine stimulant and helps menstrual flow and relieves menstrual pain.

SPEARMINT Mentha spicata Mintys Ysbigog

Other names: GARDEN MINT: LAMB MINT.

'Stirs up venery and bodily lust.' (Culpeper). Represses the milk in womens' breasts. Relieves menstrual problems.

ST. JOHN'S WORT Hypericum perforatum Eurinllys Trydwll Other names: BALM OF THE WARRIOR'S WOUND: ROSE OF SHARON: AARON'S BEARD

If a childless wife walked naked to pick St. Johns Wort, she would conceive within a year. Used for irregular menstruation, menopausal disturbances, and PMT.

TANSY Tanacetum vulgare Tanclys

Let those women that desire children love this herb, it is their best companion, their husbands excepted (Culpeper) The plant was said to grow profusely where rabbits abound! Medicinally used to stimulate the uterus, to cure failure to menstruate and could also be used for abortions.

WILD THYME Thymus serpyllum Gruw Breckland

Other names: MOTHER OF THYME: CREEPING THYME.

'Comforts and strengthens the head, stomach and womb.' (Culpeper) Relieves painful menstruation, mastitis and causes uterine contractions.

<u>VERVAIN</u> <u>Verbena officinalis</u> <u>Briw'r March</u> Other names: PIGEON'S GRASS: SIMPLERS JOY: DIVINE WEED.

Increases lactation and stimulates the uterus.



DIGESTION ORGANAU TREULIADOL

ALECOST Tanecetum balsamita Mintys Mair

Other names: COSTMARY BIBLELEAF.

The aromatic herb was once used as a fragrant bookmaker. A tea was made to ease stomach cramps and the pain of childbirth.

BERGAMOT Monarda didyma

Other names: OSWEGO TEA: BEE BALM.

This herb was used by the Oswego Indians from Lake Ontario to make a herbal tea. Medicinally it benefits digestion, cures minor digestive complaints and colic.

CHAMOMILE Chamaemelum nobile Camri

Other names: ROMAN CHAMOMILE: CAMOMILE.

It was used as a strewing herb in medieval days. Beatrix Potter's Peter Rabbit took chamomile tea after over indulging on Mr McGregor's radishes.

The herb is mainly used for digestive disorders.

CHICORY Cichorium intybus Ysgellog

Other names: SUCCORY

It was grown as a vegetable in Roman times and is still grown as a winter vegetable in Europe. It was also used to make coffee. Aids digestion and cleans the blood.

COMFREY Symphytum officinalis Llysiau'r Cwlwm

Other names: See list in BONES.

It was and is grown for fodder and as composting material. Used for gastric ulcers and irritable bowel syndrome.

ECHINACEA Echinacea purpurea Echinacea

Clears digestive upsets.

FENNEL Foeniculum vulgare Ffenigl

Probably brought into Britain by the Romans as a medicine for indigestion and to flavour food. Relieves digestive problems and helps lose weight.

FEVERFEW Tanecetum parthenium Wermodwen

Brought into Britain by medieval herbalists. It was used as a remedy for headaches but its properties were forgotten until the 1970s when a doctor's wife from Cardiff found it cured her migraines and reported it.

Used for indigestion, stomach upsets and colic.



HEARTSEASE Viola tricolor Trilliw

Other names: HERB OF TRINITY: THREE FACES IN A HOOD: LOVE IN IDLENESS: FULL ME TO YOU: PANCIES: BIDDY'S EYES: LADY'S DELIGHT: CUPID'S DELIGHT: JOHNNY JUMP-UP: TITTLE MY FANCY: LOVE INVAIN: KISS BEHIND THE GARDEN DOOR: JUMP UP AND KISS LOVE: WILD PANSY.

All such romantic names, but this flower was also used as a cure for the French pox! Also said to mend a broken heart. Eases vomiting and indigestion (a lot less romantic).

HORSERADISH Armoracia rusticana Rhuddygl Poeth

Horseradish was originally used as a medicinal plant and it was not until the 16th century that it was used for flavouring. Improves digestion and helps prevent food poisoning.

HYSSOP Hyssopus officinalis Isop

A tonic on the digestive system.

LAVENDER (ENGLISH) Lavandula angustifolia Lafant

The name comes from the Latin 'lavare' to wash. It was used in the few soaps available in medieval days but as people rarely washed, they used it instead as a perfume and to strew amongst linen. Used medicinally to relieve colic, flatulence and indigestion.

LEMON BALM Melissa officinalis Gwenynddail Other names: see list in CHILDBIRTH.

Lemon balm tea has a calming effect and 'chaseth away melancholy.' Also said to 'revive patients from death.' used to improve digestion, lack of appetite and relieve digestive disorders.

<u>LILY OF THE VALLEY</u> <u>Convallaria majalis</u> <u>Clych Enid</u> <u>Other names:</u> CONVAL LILY: MALE LILY: LILY CONFANCY: LIRICON FANCY: OUR LADY'S TEARS.

The name derives from its natural habitat. Lily of the Valley water was so valued that it was stored in vessels of gold or silver. Relieved vomiting.

LOVAGE Levisticum officinalis Llwfach

In medieval days, Lovage was associated with love potions and aphrodisiacs. Benefits digestion, relieves indigestion, colic, flatulence and poor appetite.

POT MARIGOLD Calendula officinalis Melvn Mair

It was used as a hair dye in the mid 16th century and as a poor man's saffron to colour and flavour food, dye fabrics and for cosmetics. Medicinally it relieved inflamed digestive tract and stomach ulcers.

MARSHMALLOW Althaea offlcinalis Hocys y Morfa

Originally used to make soft pastilles for throat infections, eventually used to make marshmallows. It was also recommended that teething babies chew on the root (scrubbed!) to find relief. It also drew out splinters. Used for digestive disorders and weight loss.

MILK THISTLE Silybum marianum Ysgall Mair
Other names: See list in CHILDBIRTH.

'The best remedy that grows against all melancholy diseases.' (Gerard) Stimulates appetite and aids digestion.



MINT (APPLE) Mentha suaveolens Mintys Deilgrwn
Other names: ROUND LEAF MINT: WOOLLY MINT; MONK'S HERB.

Taken to counteract indigestion.

NASTURTIUM Tropaeolum majus Meri a Mari

'One plant doth occupie a great circuit of ground.' (Gerard). The plant originated in South America and was introduced to Europe in the 16th century by the Conquistadores. Taken to improve digestion and prevent scurvy.

PEPPERMINT Mentha piperita Mintys Poethion

Complaints of the stomach, wind, vomiting, morning sickness.

PLANTAIN (GREATER) Plantago major Llwynhidydd Mawr

Other names: COMMON PLANTAIN: GREATER PLANTAIN: RAT TAIL

PLANTAIN: WHITE MAN'S FOOT.

Used as a treatment for colitis, gastritis and Cystitis.

RHUBARB Rheum officinalis Rhiwbarb

Other names: CHINESE RHUBARB

Pre-1782 all supplies of rhubarb were controlled by the Chinese and Russians until Europeans managed to get samples of living plants. Taken to improve digestion.

ROSEMARY Rosmarinus officinalis Rhosmari

Greek scholars wore garlands of rosemary to aid their memory during examinations. It was also said to cure bad dreams, bring eternal youth and cure the plague. Taken for indigestion and relieve digestive problems.

SAGE Salvia officinalis Saets

Cures digestive problems and a sage tea will aid digestion.

SORREL Rumex acetosa (crispus) Suran y Cŵn

Other names: SHEEP'S SORREL (YELLOW DOCK: CURLED DOCK)

Romans used it to cure scurvy. Cleanses the tissues of toxins that build up through poor digestion.

TANSY Tanacetum vulgare Tanclys

Tansy is one of the bitter Passover herbs and is cooked into Tansy cake (a type of omelet) which is eaten at Easter. Benefits digestion, expels threadworm in children and intestinal parasites.

YARROW Achillea millefolium Milddail

Other names: See list in BONES.

Was said to cure all wounds caused by edged tools. Cured baldness and a nervous headache. The leaves held over the eyes bestowed the gift of second sight. Also taken to relieve indigestion.



EYES LLYGAID

BERGAMOT Monarda didyma

Other names: OSWEGO TEA: BEE BALM.

Relieves sore eyes.

BISTORT Persicaria bistorta Llys y Neidr

syn. Polygonum bistorta

Other names: ENGLISH SERPENTARIA: SNAKEWEED: EASTER LEDGES.

The English names come from the snake-like rhizomes. Removes inflammation of the eyes.

BORAGE Borago officinalis Tafod y Fuwch

Other names: STARFLOWER: BEE BREAD.

Relief for sore eyes.

BROAD BEAN Vicia faber Ffaen

Relieves swollen eyes.

CARAWAY Carum carvi Carwas

'Helps to sharpen the eyesight' (Culpeper)

CARROT (WILD) Daucus carota Moronen y Maes

Important vegetable since classical times for medicines, fodder and food.

Contains large amounts of vitamin A and if eaten regularly would improve vision, especially at night.

CHAMOMILE Chamaemelum nobile Camri

Used as an eye wash.

CLARY SAGE Salvia sclarea Llygad Crist

Other names: CLEAR EYE: EYE SEED: CHRIST'S EYE: CLARY

Seed soaked in water forms a thick mucilage used to remove grit and dust from the eye.

CORNFLOWER Centaurea cyanus Penlas yr Ŷd

Other names: RAGGED SAILOR: CORN BLUEBOTTLE: SULTAN'S FLOWER:

HURTSICKLE: BACHELOR'S BUTTONS.

Stems said to be so hard they blunted harvest sickles. Used for treating corneal ulcers, conjunctivitis and as an eyewash.

ELECAMPANE Inula helenium Marchalan

'Roots beaten and put into ale and drunk daily clears, strengthens and quickens the sight of the eyes wonderfully.' (Culpeper).

FENNEL Foeniculum vulgare Ffenigl

Used as an eye wash.

FLAX Linum usitatissimum Llin Amaeth

Other names: FLAXSEED: LINSEED

Clears eye problems.



GREATER CELANDINE Chelidonium majus Dilwydd
Other names: KILL WART: WART FLOWER: SWALLOW WORT.

It was claimed that swallows used the juice of the celandine to feed their young and improve their eyesight. 'One of the best cures for the eye.' (Culpeper).

<u>HOREHOUND</u> <u>Marrubium vulgare</u> <u>Llwyd y Cŵn</u> Other names: WHITE HOREHOUND: COMMON HOREHOUND.

One of the five bitter herbs traditionally eaten at Passover. 'The juice thereof with wine and honey, helps to clear the eyesight.' (Culpeper)

IRIS (YELLOW FLAG) Iris pseudacorus Iris Felen

'Distilled water of the whole herb, f lowers and roots, is a sovereign good remedy for watering eyes.' (Culpeper)

LAVENDER (ENGLISH) Lavandula angustifolia Lafant Dimness of sight.

LILY OF THE VALLEY Convallaria majalis Clych Enid
Other names: see list in DIGESTION.

'The distilled water dropped into the eyes, helps inflammations there.' (Culpeper) The fragrance was said to help the nightingale to choose a mate.

LOVAGE Levisticum officinalis Llwfach Aids the eyes.

POT MARIGOLD Calendula officinalis Melyn Mair

Other names: EASTER FLOWER

A green dye from the plant was used to paint Easter eggs. Used to treat eye conditions including diseases of the retina and glaucoma. POISONOUS WHEN FRESH.

PURPLE LOOSESTRIFE Lythrum salicaria Llysiau'r Milwr Coch

Other names: GRASS-POLLY

'No better cure for sore eyes' (Culpeper). He also claimed it would cure blindness.

RIBWORT PLANTAIN Plantago lanceolata Llwyn Lidydd

Other names: SOLDIERS: FIGHTING COCKS: RIBWORT

Has similar properties to Greater Plantain (Plantago major) – used to treat eye inflammations and conjunctivitis.

ROSEMARY Rosmarinus officinalis Rhosmari

Other names: HERBY GRASS: HERB OF GRACE.

'The decoction thereof in wine, helps the cold distillations of rheum into the eyes' and to 'clear dim sight.' (Culpeper)

Cure-all for bruises, black eyes and broken bones and as an eye-wash.

'Take as many strawberries as you think fitting and put in a glass which being well closed, sit it in a bed of horse dung water for your use. Excellent for hot inflammed eyes.' (Culpeper)

TEASEL (COMMON) Dipsacus fullonum Crib-y-Pannwr

Water collected in the leaf joint collected as an eyewash. (Culpepper)

WILD VERVAIN Verbena officinalis Briw'r March

'The distilled water of the herb when it is in full strength, dropped into the eyes, cleanses them from films, clouds and mists and wonderfully strengthens the optic nerve.'
(Culpeper)

YELLOW LOOSESTRIFE Lysimachia vulgaris Trewynyn

Other names: COMMON YELLOW LOOSESTRIFE: WILLOW-HERB.

For the cure of sore eyes this herb has been considered equal if not superior to Eyebright.

Lymphatic system and dilates peripheral blood vessels.

Seeds are very high in Omega 3. Reduces cholesterol, blood pressure and thrombosis and used to treat a variety of heart problems

Releives haemorroids and treatment for varicose veins. Constricts blood vessels.

PARSLEY Petroselium hortense Persli Stimulates circulation of the blood and cures aneamia.

PERIWINKLE Vinca Minor Perfagl

Other names: LESSER PERIWINKLE: SORCERER'S VIOLET: DICKY DILVER: CUT FINGER.

A condemned man wore garlands of periwinkle on his way to the gallows. Used medicinally for haemorrhage, heavy menstruation, nosebleeds, stops any bleeding.

Used medicinally to treat angina.

POPPY (FIELD) Papaver rhoeas Pabi Coch Other names: CORN ROSE.

The poppy denoted fertility. It was used as a mild sedative.

<u>POT MARIGOLD</u> <u>Calendula officinalis</u> <u>Melyn Mair</u> Improves blood circulation, relieves varicose veins and bruises.







Taken to ease bronchial congestion.

Tuberculosis, dry coughs and bleeding lungs.

SORREL Rumex acetosa (crispus) Suran y Cŵn

Other names: CURLED DOCK: YELLOW DOCK

Dry cough, sore throat and laryngitis.

SWEET VIOLETS Viola odorata Fioled Ber

Other names: GARDEN VIOLETS

This flower is sacred to Aphrodite, the goddess of love. Used for respiratory disorders, bronchitis, asthma, whooping cough, catarrh and throat infections.



Anti spasmodic, it relaxes spasms and restlessness in children.

Other names: LADY'S SMOCK: MILKMAIDS: MEADOW CRESS.

Arrests spasms.

DAISY Bellis perennis Llygaid y Dydd

'The daisies do mitigate all kinde of paines, but especially of the joints and gout, if they be stamped with new butter unsalted, and applied upon the pained place' (Gerard) Relaxes muscles and spasms.

ECHINACEA Echinacea purpurea Echinacea

For the treatment of glandular fever.

ELECAMPANE Inula helenium Marchalan

Stimulates the immune system and relaxes muscular spasms.

EVENING PRIMROSE Oenothera biennis Melyn yr Hwyr

The plant originated in North America and was introduced into Europe in the 17th century. It regulates the hormonal and immune systems, is a muscle strengthener and is used for MS.

FEVERFEW Tanacetum parthenium Wermodwen

Relaxes muscular spasms.



FLAX Linum perenne Llingmaeth Other names: FLAXSEED: LINSEED Currently being researched to use against some types of cancers. Regulates the hormonal and immune systems and relieves pains in muscles and joints. **FOXGLOVES** Digitalis purpurea Bysedd Y Cŵn Other names: See list in HEART AND BLOOD. Dr. William Withering made the connection with heart disease after observing a wise woman using it in 1785 in Shropshire. Curtis - 'smiles at every attempt of the painter to do them justice'. Medicinally used for swellings of the lymph glands and for paralysis. **FUMEWORT** Corvdalis solida Caledwraidd Flowers in the spring and then disappears. Used to control muscle spasms. **GYPSYWORT** Lycopus eurapaeus Llvs v Sipsiwn Gypsies used this herb to blacken their faces to pass themselves off as exotic Africans while performing magic or telling fortunes. Used to ease palpitations in thyroid patients. HEARTSEASE Viola tricolor **Trilliw** Other names: see list in DIGESTION. Eases the pain of rheumatism. LAVENDER (ENGLISH) Lavandula angustifolia Lafant Muscle tension. LEMON BALM Melissa officinalis Gwenynddail Relaxes muscle spasms. POT MARIGOLD Calendula officinalis Melvn Mair Balances female reproductive system as it has an oestrogenic action which regulates hormones in the male and female body. MULLEIN Verbascum thapsis Pannog Melyn Other names: See list in DIGESTION. Rheumatic pain, cramps and convulsions. PASQUE FLOWER Pulsatilla vulgaris Blodyn v Pasg Other names: EASTER FLOWER. For muscular spasms. Papaver somniferum POPPY (OPIUM) Cwsglvs Used medicinally by the Sumerians in the 4thC BC, it contains morphine and codeine. It is illegal to grow the plant in America and some parts of Australia. It is used as a preoperative analgesic and muscle relaxant and controls spasms.

Prostate problems.

Relieves muscular tension.



Other names: BLACK HELLEBORE: SETTERWORT:BEAR'S FOOT

'Black' refers to the colour of the roots and was used to cure madness in classical times. Its use for nervous disorders is said to have arisen when a Greek shepherd noticed its effect on his goats. 'Effective against all melancholy diseases,' (Culpeper). Nervous and mental disorders, insanity and falling sickness (epilepsy).

CORIANDER Coriandrum sativum Llysiau'r Cwlwm

Other names: CHINESE PARSLEY: CILANTRO.

Nervous disorders.

COWSLIP Primula veris Briallu Mair

Other names: See list in MUSCLES & GLANDS.

Neuralgia and as a sedative.

ECHINACEA Echinacea purpurea Echinacea

Anti inflammatory, meningitis.

FENNEL Foeniculum vulgare Ffenigle

Anti depressant.

LAVENDER (ENGLISH) Lavandula angustifolia Lafant Neuralgia, sedative, anxiety, stress and depression. Melissa officinalis Gwenynddail Said to be able to revive patients from death. Also helps with headaches, restlessness, relieves stress and anxiety, nervous disorders and depression, altzheimers and dementia. Filipendula ulmaria MEADOWSWEET **Erwain** Other names: QUEEN OF THE MEADOW: DROPWORT: BRIDEWORT. Meadowsweet was the original source of aspirin and not willow as is commonly thought. 'It makes the heart merrie and joyful and delighteth the senses'. (Gerard) An effective painkiller and used for headaches. Paeonia officinalis Taken to relieve epilepsy and convulsions. PASQUE FLOWER Pulsatilla vulgaris Blodyn y Pasg Other names: EASTER FLOWER Used as a sedative and to relieve neuralgia, irritability and depression and for nervous exhaustion. POPPY (OPIUM) Papaver somniferum Contains morphine and codeine and made into opium. Culpeper advocated taking feverfew to counteract too much opium! used as a sedative, to relieve pain, for shock and headaches. Rosmarinus officinalis ROSEMARY Rhosmari Aids memory and concentration, relieves tension, depression and fatigue and used as a nerve tonic. **RUE** Ruta graveolens Rhuw Alleviates hysteria, neuralgia, epilepsy and vertigo. Salvia officinalis Is a calmative herb which fortifies a debilitated nervous system, relieves stress and fatigue and helps improve memory. SCARLET PIMPERNEL Anagallis arvensis Llys y Cryman Other names: POOR MAN'S WEATHERGLASS: SHEPHERD'S SUNDIAL: JOHN-GO-TO- BED-AT-NOON: WINK A PEEP. 'It purges the head.'
