Congratulations to Dan who was awarded the OBE in the Queen's birthday honours list for his charity work

Dan was chairman of the South and Mid Glamorgan Branch of the Welsh Historic Gardens Trust when the Committee initiated the project and, with members of the 750 Cowbridge Charter Trust, set up the Cowbridge Physic Garden Trust. He has continued as Chairman of the CPGT despite the pressure of his work with the Heritage Lottery Fund, the Order of St John, and the National Trust.



He has also worked with the National Botanic Gardens and other local charities.

Thanks are also due to Graham Duffield for continuing to supply the permanent plant labels in English, Latin and Welsh
